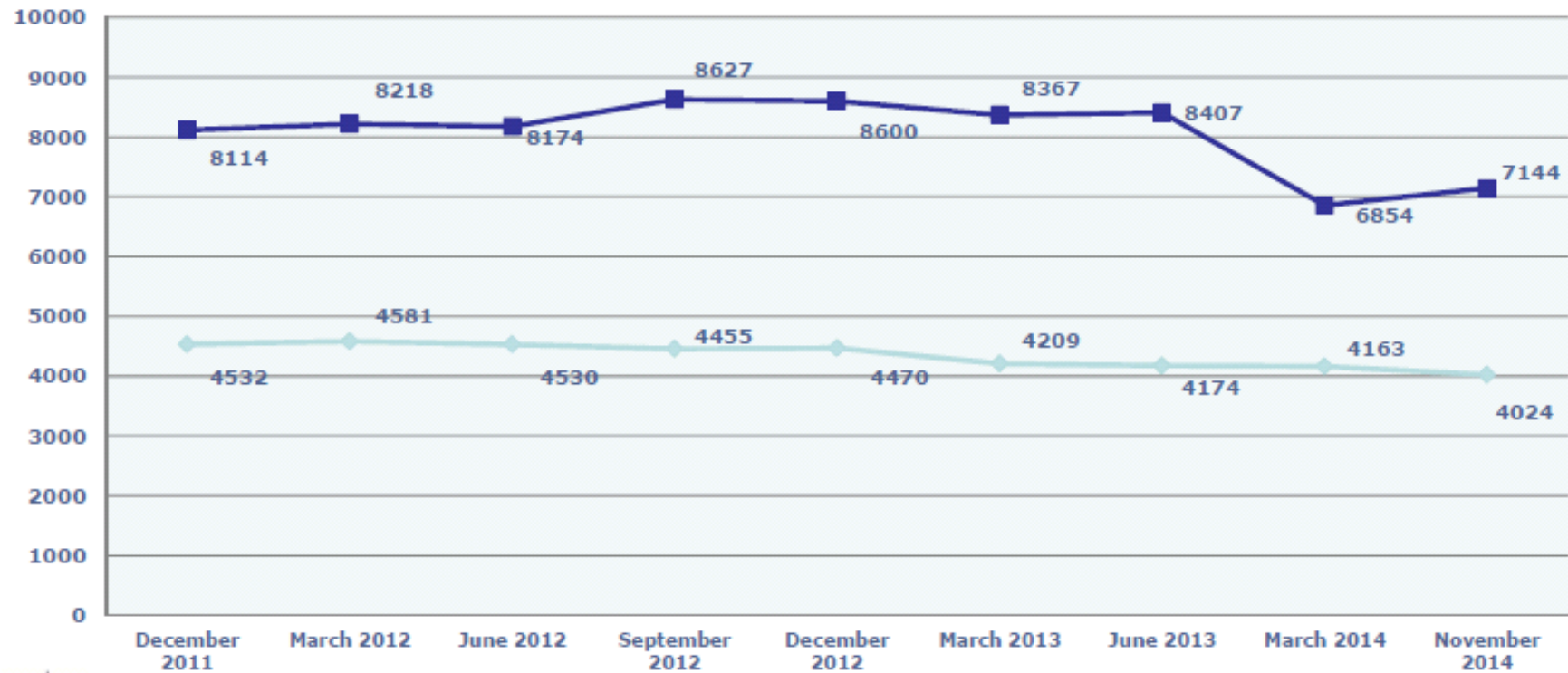

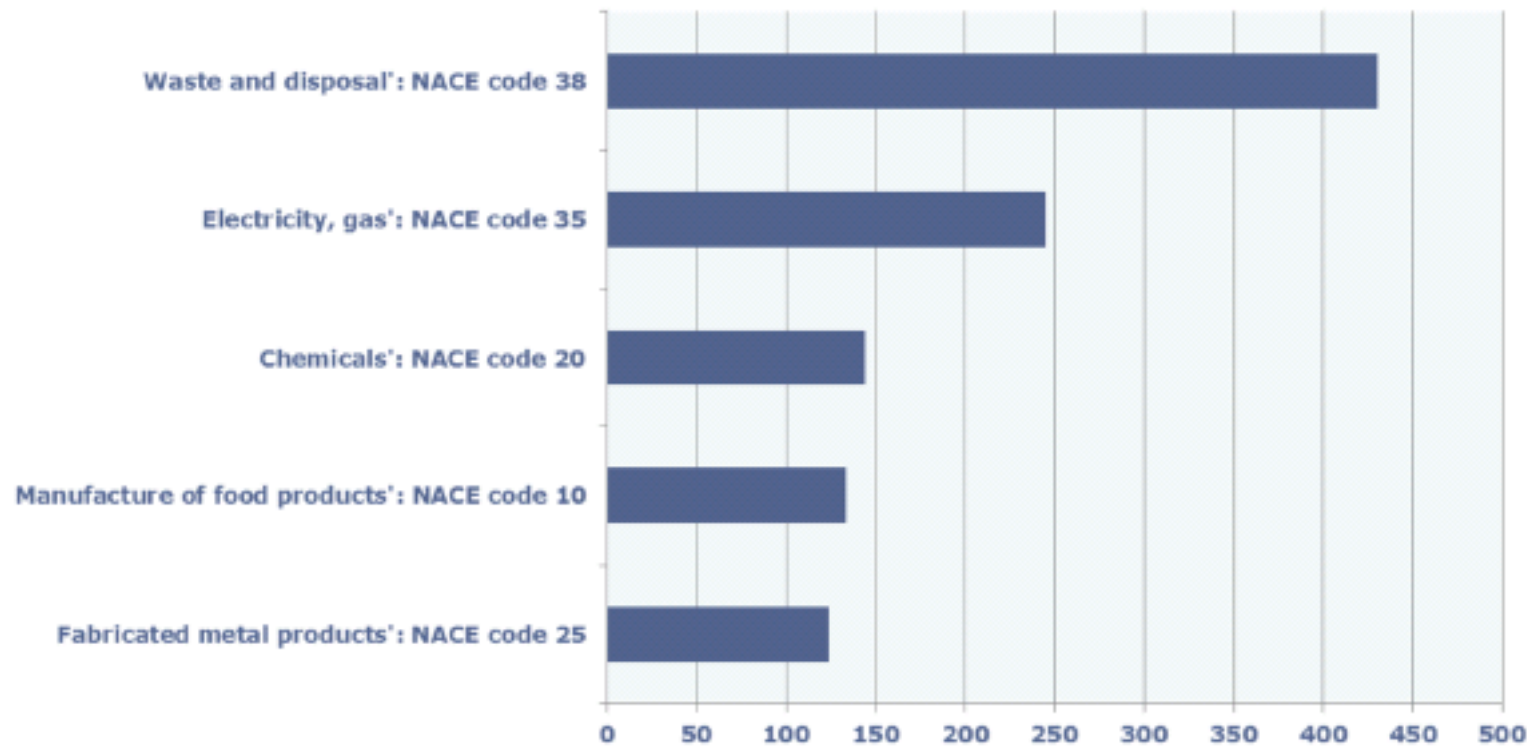
Registration numbers over time



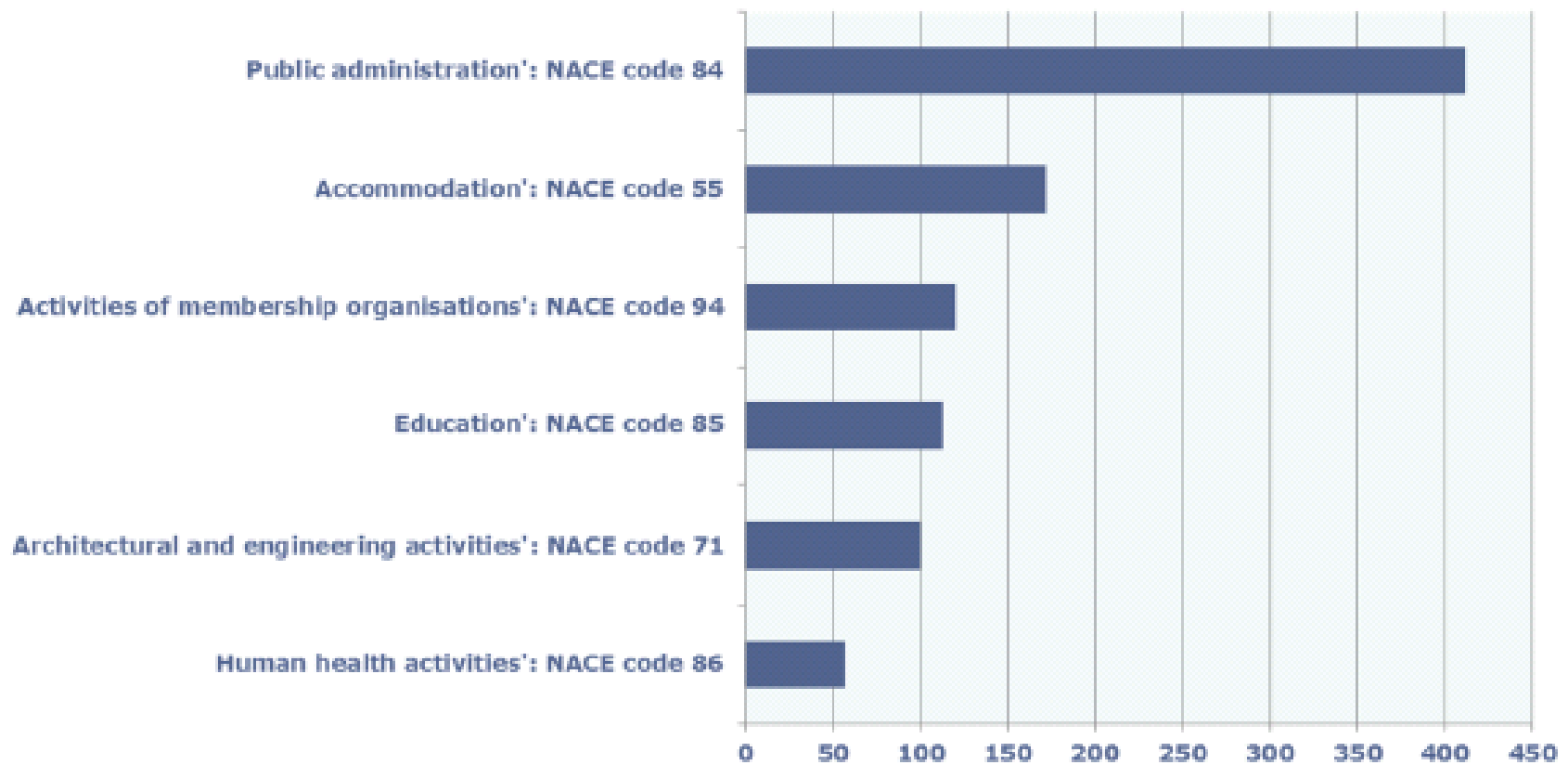

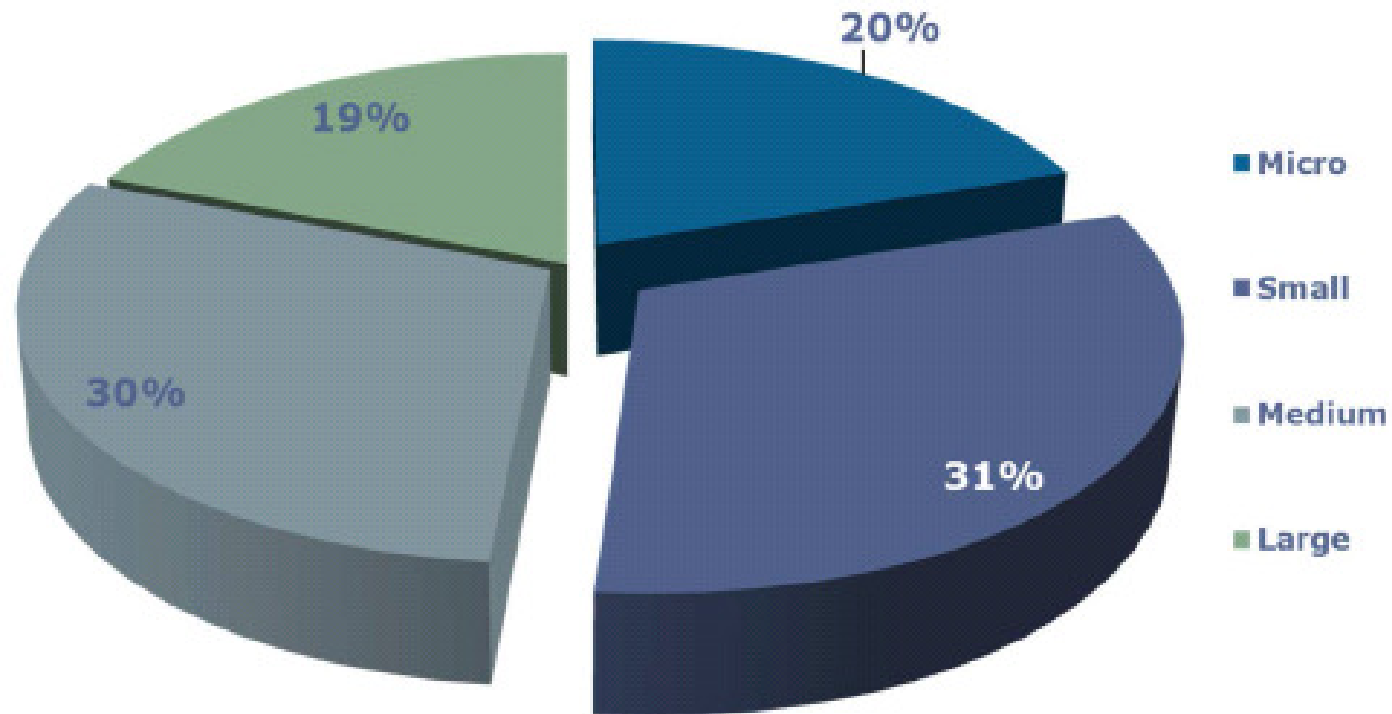
Leading industrial sectors – registrations per NACE Code

- Analyse the **strengths and weaknesses** of EMAS and thereby to identify elements for a possible review;
- Evaluation– in the context of a **REFIT mandate** – the EU added value, relevance, coherence, effectiveness and efficiency of the EMAS Regulation; and
- providing key findings for the ex-ante part of the study, which focuses on **exploring various possibilities for the development of the scheme** (if deemed necessary).

The results -> **Sectoral Reference Documents (SRDs) on best environmental management practice**
